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- Students may choose to use support courses to satisfy general education categories, but may not be required to do so. Note: If a course is used to satisfy two or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does not reduce the credit total required for graduation.

Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the univ ersity must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First $Y$ ear

\# These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.

These five courses must be taken within the first 60 credits of the student's program. Exceptions may be made for students who transfer into Political Science depending on the number of transferred credits, which could also include a waiver of the requirement for POL101.
