Additional Major, Concentration or Minor (15-36 credits minimum)

Credits will vary depending on requirements associated with major or minor selection. All students must take sufficient free electives to

alla	ain the 120 credits required for graduation.	

• Students may choose to use support courses to satisfy general education categories, but may not be required to do so. **Note:** If a course is used to satisfy two or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does **not** reduce the credit total required for graduation.

- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year
 Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- # These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- Level II and Level III Written Communications Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- * Theory or Method courses chosen from among the approved list and MUST be taken PRIOR to IDS389.
- ** Courses must focus on U.S. topics and be at the 200 level or above. This includes courses which explore the U.S. in comparative or transnational perspectives. Courses to be chosen from approved courses in consultation with advisor.
- + 2-3 Courses from the following Departments at the 200 level or above: Art + Design (Art History courses only); English; World Languages and Cultures (culture courses only); Music; Philosophy. (Note: MUS 109 is included among approved courses).
- ++ 2-3 Courses from the following Departments at the 200 level or above: Economics; Geography; History; Political Science; Sociology.
