Students may choose to use support courses to satisfy general education categories, but may not be required to do so. Note: If a course is used to satisfy two or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does not reduce the credit total required for graduation.

- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and
- general education requirements. # These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- No more than 55 (57 in Accounting) credits, including free elective and/or minor, may be taken in the School of Business. Courses offered by the Economics
- Department do not count in this 55 credit limitation. Level II and Level III Written Communications Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may t
