First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and

general education requirements.

Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in t a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area Students wishing to register for ACC 485 must obtain the permission of the Department Chairperson
