- ▼ Students may choose to use support courses to satisfy general education categories, but may not be required to do so. Note: If a course is used to satisfy two or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than requirement does not reduce total required for graduation.
- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- Across the categories of "Approached to Language, Literacy and Writing" and "Genre", students must distribute 6 credits from the following courses: ENL321, ENL322, ENL411, ENL412, ENL420, ENL421, ENL422, ENL423, and ENL424.
- Graduate writing electives are to be chosen from the following courses: ENG818, ENG819, ENG820, ENG 822A, ENG825, ENG830, ENG833, ENG855.
