- or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does **not** reduce the credit total required for graduation.
- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- To satisfy the Professional Skills requirement:
 - Elementary foreign language 101-102 for two languages or complete the University Foreign Language Requirement Or, Choose any TWO courses from TWO of the following course groups:
 - Writing and Communications: COM 201, COM 202, ENL 310, ENL 311, ENL 317.
 - Business and Management: BUS 170, BUS 340, MGT 231, MIS 201, MIS 310, ACC 106, ACC 202.
 - Digital Media and Web Design: ART 284, ART 303, ART 314, ART 324, ART 410.
 - Information Technology: ITC 117, ITC 121, ITC 132, ITC 146, ITC 181, ITC 241.
 - Art History: ART 232, ART 233, ART 234, ART 236, ART 332, ART 333, ART 334A
