- Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- † Two elective courses must be selected from MCO courses with a DPDS or WC tag.
- Select two electives from the following list: MCO 260, MCO 280, MCO 305, MCO 315, MCO 332, MCO 333, MCO 495, and no more than 3 credits from either MCO 508 or MCO 509
- At least two of the MCO Major Electives must be taken at the 300-level or higher.
