Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does not reduce the credit total required for graduation.

- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- * These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- Level II, Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
