- ▼ Students may choose to use support courses to satisfy general education categories, but may not be required to do so. Note: If a course is used to satisfy two or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does **not** reduce the credit total required for graduation.
- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- Level II and Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- Art major Foundation Requirements. The following courses must be completed in the student's first year in the Art Department: ART 101, ART 102, and ART203. ART 303 must be completed in the student's second year. This applies to transfer students as well.
- Students concentrating in Art History must select 4 of the 8 following courses: ART 236, ART 334A, ART 334A, ART 335, ART 336, ART 338, ART 402, and ART 432. Since ART 333A, 334A, 335, 336, 338, 402 and 432 are not taught every year, it is imperative that students sign up for these courses at the time they are offered.
