- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- # These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- ‡ Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- † Students who do not pass the fundamentals portion of the Music Theory Placement Exam are required to enroll in MUS 120 Fundamentals of Music and MUS 107 Fundamentals of Ear Training prior to enrolling in MUS 132N Music Theory I and MUS 122 Ear Training I.
- ¶ Students must pass the Piano Proficiency prior to registering for MUS 511N.
- Students must pass each level of Recital Attendance by attending the required number of events each semester. Transfer students are held accountable for Recital Attendance only for those semesters in which they are registered as Music Majors at Salem State University.
- Students who elect to do a full recital or recording project for their capstone will be required to take an additional semester of directed study the semester prior to registering for MUS 511N.
