- ▼ Students may choose to use support courses to satisfy general education categories, but may not be required to do so. Note: If a course is used to satisfy two or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does **not** reduce the credit total required for graduation.
  - Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- # These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the samediscipline
- Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in # a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area. Two elective courses must be selected from MCO courses with a DPDS or WC tag.
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- Select two electives from the following list: MCO 260, MCO 280, MCO 305, MCO 315, MCO 332, MCO 333, MCO 495, and no more than 3 credits from ¶ either MCO 508 or MCO 509
- At least two of the MCO Major Electives must be taken at the 300-level or higher.
