- ▼ Students may choose to use support courses to satisfy general education categories, but may not be required to do so. **Note:** If a course is used to satisfy two or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning). the requirement credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does **not** reduce the credit total required for graduation.
- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- # These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- * Up to 6 credits of Foreign Language. Students who are double majoring in World Languages and Cultures (French, Italian or Spanish concentrations) should take two 300 level or 400 level advanced courses in French, Italian or Spanish (in the same language) to fulfill the concentration electives.
- † Students wishing to register for MGT 485 must obtain permission of Department Chairperson in terms of course requirements and amount of credit hours to be granted.
- ► ENT 337 or ENT 350 is a required prerequisite for ENT 420.
