▼ Students may choose to use support courses to satisfy general education requirements but may not be required to do so. **Note:** If a course is used to satisfy two or more requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does **not** reduce the credit total required for graduation.

- ◆ Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- # These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- ‡ Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- † Students who do not pass the fundamentals portion of the Music Theory Placement Exam are required to enroll in MUS 120 Fundamentals of Music prior to enrolling in MUS132N Musicianship I. The music theory elective course must be at or above the 300 level.
- ▶ The required music history elective and one of the two additional music electives must be chosen from a 3.0 credit MUS course at or above the 300 level. The other elective can be any 3.0 credit MUS course.
- ∞ Students who elect to do a full recital or recording project for their capstone will be required to take an additional semester of directed study the semester prior to registering for MUS 511N
- ¶ Music majors must enroll in MUS 091 Recital Attendance Credit and attend the required number of events every semester.
