- requirements (for example, a support course and Scientific Reasoning requirement), the credits are counted in only one place. Using a course to satisfy more than one requirement does not reduce the credit total required for graduation.
- Courses used to satisfy the general education requirements of the university must be taken from a minimum of six different academic disciplines. First Year Seminar and Level I Written Communications courses are exempt from this restriction. Courses may not be used to fulfill both major discipline and general education requirements.
- These Scientific Reasoning General Education Category courses do not have to be a sequence or be from the same discipline.
- Level II, Level III Written Communications and Diversity, Power Dynamics and Social Justice Courses may be used to satisfy requirements anywhere else in a student's program of study where they may apply. The credits are counted only in one area.
- Number of credits determined by choices made in Additional Major/Concentration/Minor section.
- An alternative course may be selected in consultation with the department chairperson.
- Courses must address topics in Peace & Conflict and cluster around one of the following areas Africa, Europe/Mediterranean, Middle East, Asia/Oceania, Latin America, North America, Nature, Culture, or International Governance. Courses must be above the introductory level and only two courses may be taken from any single department.
